Dear Ms Tucker:

Please find attached to this letter the letter that the Board and Ms. Carey directed me to send to Chief Judge William Prior, Jr., of the Ocmulgee Judicial Circuit, requesting the Georgia Bureau of Investigation intervene in the investigation of the incidents surrounding the assault on Coach Daniels at the Hancock County football game on October 14, 2011.

The factual assertions contained in the letter to Judge Prior are distilled from the District's voluminous evidence (including more than forty (40) pages of witness statements) regarding the incident. To partially summarize these, we have included Dr. Preston's affidavit regarding the incident. This affidavit was originally to accompany the letter to Chief Judge Prior; however, because of time constraints, it was not completed in time. Regardless, it demonstrates that the factual assertions made in the letter are supported by witness statements and exhibits in Warren County School District's possession.

Please note that as a result of the urgency in getting this fairly comprehensive report sent to Judge Prior, I inadvertently attributed the statement that Dr. Preston contends that a deputy sheriff standing beside Chief Ingram made (page 5) to Chief Ingram. According to Dr. Preston's statement, while both officers swore at Dr. Preston and menaced him with their batons, the original statement - "I don't care who you are. Get your ass back before I whip your ass with this club [police baton]" was made by the Hancock County Sheriff's Department deputy standing with Chief Ingram, and not Chief Ingram himself.



Finally, while Hancock County Sheriff Primus and Hancock County School District Chief of Police Ingram have repeatedly stated that the GBI is "assisting" them with this investigation, it is my understanding that Ms. Carey has been informed that the GBI has effectively assumed control of the investigation. I believe this is a highly relevant distinction given the alleged role that Hancock County law enforcement played in this incident.
